FROM THE EDITOR

Public Health Loan Repayment Options

I'M WRITING THIS EDITORIAL FROM THE SAN DIEGO airport

on my way back from the American Student Dental Association Western Regional Conference. For two days, 350 dental students from Oregon, Washington, California, Utah, Nevada, and Arizona gathered to network and learn about the future of our profession. Topics of the educational sessions included financial planning, leadership techniques, the use of virtual reality in treatment planning and even the oft-overlooked power of gratitude. As I sat in the room with the students, I was struck by the diversity of these students. Diversity in race and gender, yes. But also diversity in the ways they wanted to practice. I talked to one student who has a son with autism and wants to focus her practice on children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. I talked to one student who wants to start her career by traveling around the country doing locum tenens work. I talked to one who wants to buy into a group practice because collaboration and shared decision-making is so important to her. And, of course, I talked to plenty of students who want to work in FQHCs like me.

Federally Qualified Health Centers – like the one I work at in Medford – provide comprehensive and emergency dental care to patients who may not be able to afford this care elsewhere. As part of my work at an FQHC, I have also received loan repayment through the National Health Service Corps (NHSC). When students come up to me asking about my work in an FQHC, it is often followed by the statement, "I have an NHSC scholarship, so I'll probably be working in an FQHC, too. Do you know much about NHSC?"

Some students have received an NHSC scholarship but don't really know what comes next, while some others are interested in working in an FQHC but aren't aware that there are loan repayment options available to them. Below is my recap of the three NHSC programs available to dentists so that we can *all* help educate our current and future colleagues about their options.

The first and most well-known program is the Scholarship Program. Students apply once they have been accepted to dental school (they can also apply during their DS1 or DS2 year for a partial scholarship). It pays for tuition, fees, and a monthly support stipend. (Some students still take out a small amount of student loans to pay for living costs.) For each year of financial support from NHSC, students agree to spend an equivalent amount of time working at an approved site in a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA). If NHSC paid for all four years of school, for example, the student would work in an approved site for four years after graduation. Most sites approved by NHSC are FQHCs, but they can also be Indian Health Service clinics, correctional facilities, departments of health, and even some private practices.

The second program – the one that I participated in – is called Students to Service (S2S). Students apply for this program in the fall of their DS4 year and make a commitment to work in an NHSC-approved site in a HPSA for three years (or six years if working part-time) after graduation. In exchange, they receive up to \$120,000 in tax-free loan repayment assistance. I really liked that this program allowed me to get through most of dental school and verify that I wanted to work in an HPSA before making a commitment.

For both the scholarship and S2S programs, dentists are allowed to do post-graduate training before their service requirement as long as it is one of five types of program: general practice residency, advanced education in general dentistry, pediatric dentistry, public health dentistry, or geriatric dentistry.

The third program is the Loan Repayment Program, which dentists apply for once they are already working in an NHSC-approved site in a HPSA. In exchange for a two-year service commitment, they receive up to \$50,000 in tax-free loan repayment assistance. There is also an option to extend this commitment for additional financial assistance.

Each state – including Oregon – has its own unique repayment programs, too, but these NHSC programs are available nationally and do not limit the state where a student goes to school, or where a dentist practices. More information can be found at https://nhsc.hrsa.gov/about-us/ nhsc-fact-sheets, and I am always happy to answer questions about my experience with the program.


Avoiding the Chronic Diseases of Aging

ODC SPEAKER HIGHLIGHT

IMAGINE IF THE MANY CHRONIC HEALTH CONDITIONS that harm

and kill millions of people every year could be traced back to a single event within the body. Think of the implications – instead of chasing after the myriad outcomes and tackling them with diverse and occasionally successful interventions, we could target the cause. Two American senior specialists in cardiovascular care, Dr. Bradley Bale and Dr. Amy Doneen, have spent the last 20 years combining their different areas of expertise to focus on arterial disease. They have seen how heart attacks, strokes, and other chronic diseases of aging – such as dementia, heart failure, kidney failure, peripheral arterial disease, erectile dysfunction, and loss of vision – can all be traced back to arterial disease. The team has gone one step deeper and designed a medical approach that addresses a specific source event behind arterial disease. Their robust approach is having a positive impact on cardiovascular disease's unwanted supremacy as the world's number one cause of death, disability, and health care cost burden.



Given the scale and scope of the cardiovascular system, the opportunities for disruption and disease are numerous, but one event merits special attention: oxidative stress (OS).

Bale and Doneen knew that arterial disease was linked to other diseases - and that there was a reason for that. The thousands of kilometers of blood vessels that run throughout our body, connecting our organs, are like the infrastructural network of roads, rail, and pipelines that service every major city. If unhealthy, they do not operate smoothly, causing blockages and congestion, affecting the organs. For, arguably, the body's two most important organs, the outcome is an increased risk of heart attack and stroke. They understood that despite significant advances in diagnosing and treating cardiovascular disease, it remained the leading cause of death and impaired health globally; a different approach to the disease was therefore needed.

Given the scale and scope of the cardiovascular system, the opportunities for disruption and disease are numerous, but one event merits special attention: oxidative stress (OS). This condition occurs when there is an imbalance between the production of harmful free radicals – highly reactive molecules - and the body's ability to neutralize or detoxify them. OS affects lipoproteins - the complex fat and protein particles that course through our vessels and the smooth muscle cells in arterial walls. The latter become genetically transformed, generating a sticky substance in the arterial wall, resulting in the lipoproteins cholesterol - getting trapped in them and ultimately causing arterial disease. This retention of cholesterol encourages further oxidation and triggers the body's immune response, resulting in inflammation in the artery. The fatty cholesterol deposits build up, producing plaque. When the condition becomes chronic, the arterial walls stiffen and clog, a condition called atherosclerosis.

Oxidative stress is the "critical link" between cholesterol and inflammation. It is the main driver behind arterial disease. Preventing it is vital to addressing the condition. They have designed a treatment regime that respects the complexities of OS causation and is straightforward enough for fellow health care practitioners to apply and customize to a specific patient's needs. The management program is holistic and requires an interdisciplinary approach. For example, oral health is a critical element.

Their method utilizes six basic steps. The first involves educating patients and practitioners on the fact that a blood clot in the arterial system blocks the flow of blood, leading to events like heart attacks and strokes.

Additionally, most of these obstructions are silent and lead to chronic diseases of aging like dementia, kidney failure, erectile dysfunction, peripheral arterial disease, and vision changes. The second step assesses for the presence of arterial disease. The third step is identifying arterial inflammation ("fire") resulting from OS. Extinguishing or limiting any future "fires" requires identifying the root cause of OS - the fourth step. Ignore the root cause, and it is only a matter of time before another, possibly fatal, "flare-up" occurs. The fifth step is setting individualized goals of therapy anchored in the sixth step, genetics.

With the above knowledge, a practitioner can design an optimal intervention for the patient, providing

achievable goals for long-term health. Because numerous sources of oxidative stress are modifiable, including poor diet, physical inactivity, weight problems, sleep disturbances, infection, periodontal disease, gut dysbiosis, vitamin D deficiency, hypertension, nicotine addiction, prediabetes, and various psychosocial issues, treatment can involve any one or a combination of proven interventions, including lifestyle changes and medication. Utilizing genetics to provide individualized care to each patient ensures the success of this approach.

Two real-world evidence research studies of data from patients treated by Bale and Doneen have highlighted the method's success. One, by the Johns Hopkins Ciccarone Center for the Prevention of Heart Disease, examined treatment results in a cohort of 324 patients treated for five years and showed comprehensive reductions in cardiovascular disease risk. Another Texas Tech Health Science Center study analyzed

data from the treatment of 576 patients over eight years. It showed regression of artery disease.

Unfortunately, many people still believe cardiovascular disease is inevitable. The reality is exciting: A person can live a long, healthy life without suffering the consequences of arterial disease. Doctors can now tell patients with arterial disease that there is a cure.

Bale and Doneen published Healthy Heart, Healthy Brain: The Personalised Path to Protect Your Memory, Prevent Heart Attacks and Strokes, and Avoid Chronic Illness. This book won the 2023 Gold Nautilus Book Award in the Health, Healing, and Wellness category and the American Society for Journalists and Authors' (ASJA) 2023 June Roth Memorial Award for Outstanding Medical Book.

THE DIET AND WELLNESS INDUSTRIES ARE WORTH about

\$73 and \$450 billion/year in the U.S., respectively, but it doesn't seem we are getting any healthier. Advancing Dental Restoration: Integrating Esthetics and Technology in Fixed Prosthodontics and Anterior Implant Dentistry

ADVANCEMENTS IN MATERIALS, EQUIPMENT, TECHNOLOGIES,

AND TECHNIQUES in the field of fixed prosthodontics and implant dentistry undoubtedly present both opportunities and challenges. The pace of innovation often leaves clinicians grappling to discern the relevance of traditional methods amidst the allure of new approaches.

While embracing new technologies and materials is essential, it is equally important to recognize the value of traditional clinical protocols. The principles of occlusion, tooth preparation, and impression making, although taught for decades, remain fundamental to successful prosthodontic treatment. The challenge for the modern clinician lies in integrating these time-honored principles with new advancements. For instance, digital impression systems offer advantages in terms of efficiency and patient comfort, but they must be used with an understanding of traditional impression techniques to ensure accuracy and effectiveness.

From the preliminary stages of diagnosis and treatment planning,

through all different steps of clinical care, to material selection, clinicians have to continuously make evidence-based decisions.

A. Diagnosis and Treatment Planning

Prosthodontic diagnosis requires a thorough patient assessment. Determining the starting point when managing a complex case is often the most daunting part of the treatment. To ensure all different factors are assessed before establishing the final restorative treatment plan, a systematic approach should be followed^{1,2} (figure 1). The following should be thoroughly evaluated:

- Occlusion (both static and dynamic)
- Occlusal vertical dimension
- Presence of wear and associated wear patterns
- Patient-related factors, such as individual functional and esthetic needs and expectations, as well as potential risk factors

In addition, a detailed esthetic analysis should be performed for all cases involving the anterior esthetic zone (figure 2). Such analysis includes assessment of the following:

- Facial and dental midlines
- Lip support
- Smile line
- Gingival zeniths
- Buccal corridors
- Upper lip length and mobility
- Anterior tooth display
- Relationship of occlusal plane with the horizontal plane as well as with the lip curvature

B. Revisiting the Tooth **Preparation & Final Impression**

Traditionally, retention and resistance form has been the cornerstone of tooth preparations for indirect restorations. In recent years, a notable shift has been made toward less aggressive techniques, and biomimetic protocols using partial coverage restorations are being widely adopted. This shift not only allows for the preservation of tooth structure in the short term, but also increases the longevity of teeth and therefore delays more costly treatments.

Another crucial clinical step in fixed prosthodontics is obtaining an accurate final impression. Tissue management remains of paramount importance, regardless of impression

technique (analog vs. digital) or material used for gingival retraction (impregnated cords vs cordless foams/ pastes). Using the latest technology for capturing a tooth preparation comes secondary to proper, effective yet delicate tissue displacement prior to making the final impression³ (figure 3).

A similar approach is followed during final impression for an anterior dental implant restoration. For these cases, the accurate transfer of the peri-implant tissue architecture during the final impression process is critical. The custom impression coping technique allows for a precise transfer of this information to the dental laboratory⁴ (figure 4).

C. Material Selection

Newer materials allow for more conservative preparations while maintaining strength and esthetics.

The shift from metal-based restorations to high-strength all-ceramic solutions presented a paradigm shift in the traditional material selection process for crowns and fixed partial dentures. These materials offer improved aesthetics and biocompatibility, but they also require a thorough understanding of their properties and limitations. Understanding different material requirements for minimum occlusal thickness, finish line, and preparation geometry is crucial for long-term success of the final restoration.

D. Navigating Clinical Challenges with Evidence-Based Practices

One of the most significant challenges in fixed prosthodontics is decision making in compromised scenarios. For example, the debate between preserving a tooth with a guestionable prognosis versus opting for an implant has been a topic of extensive research. Recent studies provide insights into success rates, patient satisfaction, and long-term outcomes of different approaches, guiding clinicians in making informed decisions. Interestingly, literature has also shown that clinicians who are more experienced in implant dentistry tend to opt for maintaining compromised natural teeth for longer periods of time (often utilizing traditional, long-standing techniques such as crown lengthening and orthodontic extrusion) instead of immediately resolving in tooth extraction and dental implant placement.⁵ This is an indication of the impact of the clinician's experiences and educational background on treatment plan choices, in addition to the numerous

tooth- and patient-related factors that were mentioned above.

Conclusion

The mastery of fixed prosthodontics and implant dentistry in the current era requires a delicate balance between embracing the new and respecting the old. Clinicians must have a deep understanding of advancements in materials and technologies, a commitment to evidence-based practices, and a comprehensive approach to treatment planning. By integrating these elements, clinicians can effectively navigate the complex challenges of fixed prosthodontics, ensuring high-quality patient care and staying at the forefront of dental practice.

She received her DDS from the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (2009), her certificate in prosthodontics, and her master's in oral biology from Texas A&M University Baylor College of Dentistry (2014). Dr. Bompolaki is the course director for multiple courses and has served as chair of the Curriculum Committee at the OHSU School of Dentistry since 2021. As a researcher, she focuses on dental implant outcomes and complication management. Her work has been internationally recognized and published in peer-reviewed journals.




REGIONAL EVENT 2023 ODA Regional Event


